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**ABSTRACT**

Enter the abstract of your paper here (should not exceed 250 words). Use 10 point Times New Roman and single-line spacing throughout.

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**BODY**

Use 1 column for the body. Use 12 point Times New Roman and single-line spacing throughout. Figures and table should be placed as close as possible to where they are mentioned in the text. First-level headings state the table or figure number. All the tables and images should be embedded into the file and sized appropriately. Divide your article into clearly defined, centered:

- **INTRODUCTION**
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- **CONCLUSION**

Maximum page for the entire article (from first page until references) is 15 pages.

**APPENDIX**

The appendix should immediately follow the body of the paper and precede the references.

**ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS**

Collate acknowledgements in a separate section at the end of the article before the references.

**REFERENCES**

References must be in English and arranged first alphabetically by author's last name and then sorted chronologically if necessary. Use [APA style \(7th edition\)](#) and include digital object identifiers (DOIs) if they have been assigned to the content. References do not exceed beyond 7 years back with 80% journal articles and 20% other sources such as books, news articles, etc.
